### Welcome to the Gulkula Regional Training Centre

The Gulkula Regional Training Centre (GRTC) offers training across a range of industry sectors where employment opportunities exist throughout North East Arnhem Land.

Our goal is to help young Yolngu men and women between 18 and 25 years who are not in work but are keen to develop their skills and be active in the workforce.

Participants who successfully complete the program are supported to move into ongoing employment.

The GRTC is a Gumatj Aboriginal Corporation business. It has been developed in collaboration with senior men and women, regional employers, service providers and government.

### Where you will live during the training

During the training, you will live at the Gulkula Regional Training Centre.

### The training

Over 17 weeks, you will receive nationally accredited training in one industry sector.

You will receive First Aid certification and strengthen your workplace literacy and numeracy. You will also learn life skills throughout the residential program.

### How is the program taught?

The training is delivered by a range of providers, including employers. It is comprehensive and staged so you can build your knowledge and skills.

The stages are:

1 Induction (five days)

2 Five x 10-day training rotations, with a four-day rest after each 10-day block

3 30 days or six five-day blocks of job-specific training





## Want to get involved?

To be a participant you need to be eligible to receive Centrelink support. You will continue to receive your Centrelink payment during training.

The program requires more than 25 hours per week so, on graduation and if you remain in employment for up to six months, you will receive a bonus of \$5,000. The payments are made on:

1. Graduation (\$2,000);
2. Three months of consecutive employment (\$1,000); and
3. Six months of consecutive employment (\$2,000).

You are expected to attend and be fully involved in all aspects of the training and recruitment, 100 per cent. Requirements for leave will be managed on a case-by-case basis.

Participants will be selected by a panel that includes GRTC staff and senior men and women. It is a two-stage recruitment process.

You are required to register interest and apply. You will then complete Discovery, a spoken and activity-based individual assessment, and attend a two-day residential Recruitment Workshop. After completing the Recruitment Workshop, an assessment will be made and you will be advised if you have been selected to join the program.
